PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Basic Nursing Assistant Training Program (BNATP) at Lakeside Health Institute, Inc. is a comprehensive, state-approved program designed to prepare students to provide quality care in a variety of healthcare settings. This 4-week program consists of 120 total clock hours, including 40 clinical hours, and complies with the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) regulations for Nursing Assistant Training.

Students will gain foundational knowledge and practical skills necessary for employment as certified nursing assistants (CNAs) in long-term care facilities, hospitals, home health, and other healthcare environments. The curriculum emphasizes the development of essential skills such as communication, infection control, safety, personal care, basic nursing procedures, and ethical and legal responsibilities.

Upon successful completion of the program, students will be eligible to take the Illinois CNA Competency Examination to be placed on the Illinois Nurse Aide Registry.



PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Graduates of the program will be able to:

- Demonstrate understanding of basic nursing concepts and principles of patient care.
- Perform essential nursing assistant skills safely and accurately in clinical settings.
- Communicate effectively with patients, families, and members of the healthcare team.
- Uphold ethical and legal standards in nursing assistant practice.
- Apply principles of infection prevention and control in all care activities.
- Provide culturally competent, person-centered care that promotes dignity and independence.
- Prepare for the successful completion of the Illinois CNA Competency Exam.
